

WILL DEDICATE CHURCH.

Catholic Prelates to Conduct Ceremony at St. Francis de Sales'.

St. Francis de Sales' Church, located on the site of the historic Queen Chapel, at Rhode Island avenue and Eighteenth street, Langdon, will be dedicated tomorrow afternoon at 4 o'clock by Rt. Rev. A. A. Curtis. He will be assisted by Rev. David H. Buel, D. D., of Georgetown University, and Rev. E. M. Southgate, pastor of St. Anthony's Church, Brookland. Rev. E. A. Pace, of the Catholic University, will deliver the sermon.

Rt. Rev. Bishop D. J. O'Connell, rector of the Catholic University, will be present, as will many of the local clergy and members of the Knights of Columbus, the Ancient Order of Hibernians, and the Catholic Knights of America. The music for the occasion will be rendered by the student choir of Holy Cross College. The ceremonies will be in charge of Rev. G. A. Dougherty, of the Catholic University, and Rev. A. M. Mark, pastor of the church.

DEATH PENALTY IS IMPOSED.

Judge DeLacy Orders the Execution of Vicious Dog.

Judge DeLacy imposed his first death sentence yesterday, when he ordered a dog shot. It belonged to Lee Osborne, of 1244 G street southeast. Recently a number of Osborne's neighbors complained to the authorities that the animal was vicious and had bitten several persons.

The case was brought before the court yesterday morning with William Middleton, thirteen years old, as the principal witness. The boy exhibited a badly lacerated arm, which, he said, was the result of the dog's attack upon him. The dog was surrendered to the poundmaster, and the mandate of the court was carried out.
